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FOREWORD

Due to the continuous instability in the region, the Mission of the United Nations for the stabilization of the Democratic Republic of Congo ("MONUSCO") mandate has been extended and further strengthened, showing the resolve of the international community to stabilize the region. For the first time ever, the UN has authorized MONUSCO to undertake "offensive operations" to prevent the extension and neutralize armed groups.

Whereas the presence and actions of the MONUSCO seemed to have resulted in a significant reduction of atrocities in the first half of 2014, the situation escalated in October 2014 resulting in approximately 250 deaths in and around Beni. This has directly and strongly impacted our orphanage. We are sad to report that various family members of our dear colleague and friend Josephine Mantombela have fallen victim to these atrocities. Also due to the security concerns, we evacuated the orphanage and transferred the children and the sisters to the nearby city of Butembo where they found refuge in another set–up from the congregation of the Sisters.

Further, the construction of the new school had to be interrupted for several months and construction costs have been impacted by inflation resulting from the escalation.

We are also sad to report that Daniel, one of our children passed away in 2014. Daniel was born with reduced mobility and brain function and the sisters had taken significant efforts to rehabilitate him. Unfortunately the struggle was lost and Daniel died at the age of 4.

Nevertheless, there are also more positive news to report.

Early 2015 the situation has become a bit more stable and we hope to be

able to repatriate the children back to the orphanage in Beni Paida soon. Some of the older children have been reintegrated into their wider family. The sisters continue to regularly follow up with the families to ensure the well-being of the children and their ability to attend school. As one of these evaluations has not been satisfactory, Marie-Louise, has been reintegrated to the orphanage. Her family could not guarantee her well-being and education.

In addition, we are happy and proud to report positive returns from the fund raising related to the construction of the school complex. A total of 4 classrooms have been finalized. Though there is still a long way to go until the complete infrastructure would be finalized, the sisters are now planning to start allowing the first children to attend classes in the new facilities.

We are incredibly proud to see that though the violence in the region can hurt us and slow down process, it can't stop us. Thanks to the continuous support of its sponsors, PaidaOrphanage has become a beacon of resistance, solidarity and hope. Resistance, to not give in to violence. Solidarity, showing the strong bond that humanity created amongst a group of people from different nations, religions and ethnicities. And hope, that one day the children of PaidaOrphanage and the region may live a better life.

We thank all our donors for their kind support to keep the beacon shining.

PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT

This report is directed towards sponsors, donors, beneficiaries, staff members and all other people interested in the activities of PaidaOrphanage. It gives an outline of the work of PaidaOrphanage and the actions we have undertaken during 2014 to meet our objectives.

WHO WE ARE

The orphanage was created in 1929 in the neighborhood of Paida, city of Beni in the Democratic Republic of the Congo ("DRC"). It is currently being managed by 2 Sisters from the order of the "Soeur Oblates de l'Assomption" supported by two nurses. Other Sisters manage a hospital and a school and help out in the orphanage from time to time if required. In the summer of 2010, Marie–Laure de Quina and Daniel Hoff, visited the orphanage in the DRC.

They were both moved and impressed by what they saw there, and decided to support the Sisters by creating the association "PaidaOrphanage" in Europe. The association was established in January 2011 in Switzerland with the aim of supporting the work of the sisters and the wellbeing of the orphans through the promotion of PaidaOrphanage and centralized fundraising.

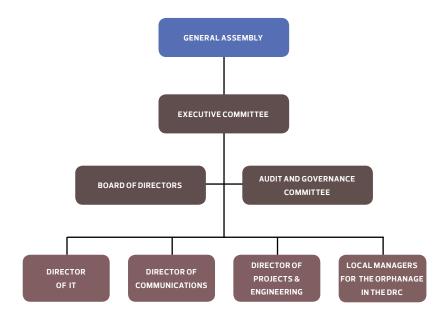

A) Governance

B) Biographies

Daniel Hoff [PRESIDENT]

I am a German national and studied Business Administration in Cologne, Germany and Lisbon, Portugal with emphasis on international management strategy and human resource management. As co-founder of Projecto Universitário em Maputo, I gained valuable insights into the creation and management of non-profit organizations in a developing context and worked several months in Mozambique. I worked various years as a consultant with PricewaterhouseCoopers in Switzerland and Brazil. I currently live in Dubai and work for Shelf Drilling, a start up company in the offshore drilling industry. Relationship to PaidaOrphanage: In 2010 I stayed for some months in the orphanage in Paida, building strong relationships with the Sisters who manage the orphanage and with the children. I was hugely impressed not only by the compassion of the Sisters, but also by their effectiveness and efficiency in managing the orphanage, despite the minimal resources. Together with my wife Marie-Laure we decided to create the PaidaOrphanage association to support the orphanage in the long term.



Marie-Laure de Quina [VICE-PRESIDENT]

Relationship to PaidaOrphanage: In 2010 I worked in the city of Beni as logistician for the ICRC. During my time there, I visited the 3 orphanages in the city and felt very comfortable with this one. Therefore I decided to support the orphanage, first by going there regularly (every weekend), then by asking Daniel to come to help them for several months by being there physically, and now through the association. We know and trust the orphanage and the Sisters managing it. We really believe in their work, in their honesty and in their will and dedication to improving the lives of these orphans.



Ruben Nascimento [DIRECTOR OF IT]

I am a Portuguese national and have been a web designer and developer since 2003. Besides having worked in several creative design agencies in Portugal, I have also worked freelance for international agencies and companies. I have studied Design for Multimedia Applications at Etic (Escola Técnica de Imagem e Comunicação) in Lisbon, Portugal and Visual Communication at Cardiff Metropolitan University in Cardiff, Wales. I started working for non-governmental projects in 2005, by designing and developing the website and logo for Projecto Universitário em Maputo (PUMAP) and, later, by helping other projects with their communication, for example the Associação Humanitária para a Educação e Apoio ao Desenvolvimento (AHEAD). For PaidaOrphanage, I am responsible for all the website. I have known Daniel Hoff for several years now and admire his and Marie-Laure's dedication to this orphanage. I passionately believe that with projects like this, it is possible to change our world by helping other people's lives, and I feel fulfilled by doing it.

María Lecanda [DIRECTOR OF COMMUNICATIONS]

I was born in Mexico, where I followed my Industrial Design studies at the Tecnológico de Monterrey (ITESM), with a specialty in System and Product Design at Aalborg Universitet, in Denmark. In 2008, I moved to Belgium where I worked as a designer for Noukie's, developing new children's furniture lines, accessories and retail furniture for the European market. Since 2012 I have dedicated myself to photography –my other passion– and have worked as a photographer doing portraits, events and shoots for private clients, as well as personal projects.



I met Daniel and Marie-Laure in Dubai, where I currently live, and found their cause and their personal motivation to help the children of Paida Orphanage quite contagious. Without thinking about it twice, I started helping with designing printed media to raise funds for the Bungulu school project, processing images for the children's sponsors and editing informative and promotional video spots about Paida Orphanage. I have gladly taken this opportunity, hoping that my background as a photographer and designer may help improve these children's lives.

Marc Suchet [DIRECTOR OF PROJECTS AND ENGINEERING]

French, I am an engineer from the Special School of Public Works (École Spéciale des Travaux Publics) in Paris. Having worked more than 10 years in the oil exploration sector, mainly in Africa and in the Middle East, and having worked also on building sites in France, I decided to re-orientate my career and to join the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in 2004. In 2010, I had the pleasure to make a mission to Beni for the ICRC, with



Marie Laure. I also met Daniel during the same period. Having visited PaidaOrphanage several times with them, I consider their project of support extraordinary. I know the Congo and the North Kivu very well, its exuberant nature, its fabulous landscapes, its so charming population that has the ability to survive with smiles and pragmatism the conflicts and poverty which have affected the region for so many decades. The orphanage is a place of serenity for the children. The peaceful atmosphere that exists there as well as the dedication of the sisters who take care of it, in spite of the minimal means at their disposal, convinced me of the value of Marie–Laure and Daniel's project. I have commited to them all my technical support to ensure a successful conclusion of this project.





AIMS OF THE ORGANIZATION AND PROGRESS UPDATE

In general, the purpose of the organization is to support schools in developing countries, in particular to provide access to basic education for the local population, especially children. Special attention is given to orphaned children. As far as possible, the association will also facilitate access to basic nutrition. and promote health. More specifically, PaidaOrphanage aims to build a school complex for at least 400 children, including an orphanage with the capacity to accommodate at least 50 orphans, in the city of Beni, district North Kivu in the DRC.

In order to achieve the aims of the organization, various projects have been established, some of them have been finalized and some are ongoing.

The following projects are currently ongoing and have progressed in 2014:

SPO - Sponsor an orphan

ORP – Creation of new orphanage and school complex

We present below an update of the progress made in 2014 for each of these projects.

PROJECT UPDATE

1. Project SPO "Sponsor an orphan"

Even if physical infrastructure does exist to accommodate orphaned children, funds are still required to guarantee a proper level of nutrition, health care and education. Occasional or monthly contributions (ideally of USD 25 per month per child) will enable PaidaOrphanage to significantly increase the quality of lives of the orphans.

To maximize the effect of these vital funds, we have ensured that **no** administrative costs are deducted from your contributions¹. Each contribution made by our donors goes *directly* to support the children and the staff of the orphanage. The sponsor will be able to follow the development of the child sponsored, but his or her financial donations will also be used to support the other children according to their needs. The funds are used to purchase food and medicaments for all the orphans. The fact that the donation is not specific to a child avoids inequalities between the orphans. Nevertheless if a sponsored child is of school age,

On December 31st 2014, 9 out of our 22 orphans were being sponsored.

the donations will be used in the first place to guarantee their tuition fees.

¹All administrative costs (fees for transfer of funds, office cost and resources) are borne by Marie-Laure de Quina and Daniel Hoff.

2. Project ORP "Creation of new orphanage and school complex"

PaidaOrphanage is working on the construction of another accommodation building for approximately 50 orphans up to the age of 18 years. In addition, the complex will include a school to provide education for the orphans and for approximately 400 children from the surrounding areas. Land has already been provided and PaidaOrphanage has a dedicated budget and plan for the construction of the infrastructure provided by a local architect and approved by our Director for Projects and Engineering.

The new orphanage will be composed of two parts. One for the "day life" comprising: the living room, a community room, the kitchen, the refectory, some storage rooms, etc. Another part will be reserved for the interns' dormitory. It will have 28 bedrooms, each with 2 beds. Two of these rooms will be for our staff, and one bedroom would be available for sick children. The 25 remaining rooms would allow us to welcome 50 orphans.

The total cost of building and equipping the orphanage is estimated at 135'000 dollars.

The new school will have 12 classrooms, an administrative building, one large room available either for studying or meetings, and a library. These 12 classrooms will allow us to welcome 400 students.

The total cost of building and equipping the school is estimated at 180'000 dollars.

Details of the layout of the school and orphanage can be found in Annex A. Details on the estimates for the school can be found in Annex B.

We are proud to report that the construction of the school has been initiated in 2013, 3 years ahead of the initial objective to start the construction in 2016, and that in 2014 the construction continued:

- 2 classrooms have been built from May the 13th 2013 to August the 20th 2013 with the help of 8 workers supervised by the local architect;
- 2 additional classrooms have been built from September 6th 2014 to November the 20th 2014 with the help of 8 workers supervised by the local architect.

We have now obtained sufficient funding in order to complete the first phase of the construction and the work is progressing.

A detailed timeline of the construction can be found in Annex C in French.

These both stages of the construction are in-line with the estimated budget as you can see in the overview below:

The first two classrooms built are already being used by more than 30 students.

Following our fundraising requests in 2014, we had several meetings and exchanges with institutional donors. Though certain institutions have declined our request for support, we have often been encouraged to touch base with them again once the construction is a bit more advanced and we have obtained more funding.

In addition to the institutional donors, the project has received support from private donors in 2014.

ANNUAL PERFORMANCE EVALUATION

A) Response to main challenges 2013

The following actions were taken in 2014 in order to mitigate the main challenges of the year 2013:

Challenge 2013	Response 2014
 Maintain a strong link between the executive committee and the local Managers of PaidaOrphanage 	Regular phone calls, emails and SMSs supported a continuous communication with the local Managers of PaidaOrphanage. Though we initially planned to have one representative of the Executive Committee visit the orphanage in the second half of 2014, the spike in insecurity in the region prevented such visit.
Workload of executive committee	No concrete action taken in 2014 to reduce workload or expand members in the Committee or the Association.

B) Main achievements in 2014

Achievements

Project SPO - Sponsor an orphan:

Engagement of sponsors to support nine children, mainly on a monthly basis, raising a total of CHF 1'978 for the year 2014.

√ The financial support of our donors has allowed PaidaOrphanage to send the orphans to either kindergarden or school. In 2014 eleven children were able to attend school thanks to our contributors

Project ORP - Creation of new orphanage and school complex:

- ✓ Additional request for fundraising were sent and resulted in positive outcome.
- A telephone call in January 2014 and a meeting in May 2014 with potential institutional donors were conducted.
- Several donations received both from private donors and from institutional donors for a total
 of CHF 15, 210 in 2014
- Construction of school continued, 2 additional classrooms were finalized on November 2014

Management of PaidaOrphanage:

Management:

- Increased communication between the Executive Committee of PaidaOrphanage and the headquarters of the Congregation of the Sisters Oblates in Paris. (Note: The orphanage is managed by representatives of the Congregation).
- ✓ Sister Patience finalized her one year internship at the orphanage and resumed her Bachelor's Degree in Psychology with emphasis on developmental psychology for children (further details can be found in our annual report 2011 under Project FOR).

Communication:

- Our Director of Communication worked on a video which we received at the end of 2013 from the DRC to prepare smaller and more appealing videos. These videos shall be used in future to promote PaidaOrphanage
- Regular updates of the website www.paidaorphanage.org
- Updates on PaidaOrphanage facebook page

Finance:

- No administrative fees levied on any donations.
- ✓ Total donations of CHF 15,210 received for the construction of the new school and orphanage complex.
- ✓ Total of CHF 19,489 transferred to PaidaOrphanage DRC in 2014.

C) Main challenges in 2014

The following table summarizes the main challenges in 2014, their context and potential mitigations/solutions proposed for 2015:

OUTLOOK

As last year, we hope that in 2015 we can raise further funds for the construction of the school. Our main efforts will be directed at following up with institutional donors in Switzerland, as mentioned earlier in this report. These efforts have so far shown positive results and we are hopeful that further support can be mobilized.

By the end of 2015, we are planning to do a thorough review of the status of the construction project as well as the effectiveness of the sponsorship of the orphans. Based on this review, we will then decide whether the strategy should be adjusted, e.g. by focusing on other potential donors, such as corporations or individuals.

If the security situation stabilizes in the second half of 2015, we will again attempt to visit the orphanage in Beni.

CONCLUSION

2014 was a very tough year for PaidaOrphanage due to the escalation of the armed conflict in Beni which directly impacted the orphanage.

Nevertheless, we are proud to report that even this escalation did not stop us from continuing to deliver on our projects.

We hope that this will further proof to our donors and potential donors how serious, capable and determined PaidaOrphanage is to continuously improve the life of our children and further contribute to a positive development of the region.

Phase 1 of the school construction is almost concluded and we have started phase 2. Also, whereas the initial goal was to start constructions by 2016, we now have some hope to complete the construction of the school by then.

We thank all supporters of PaidaOrphanage and look forward to continue contributing to improving the lives of our children.

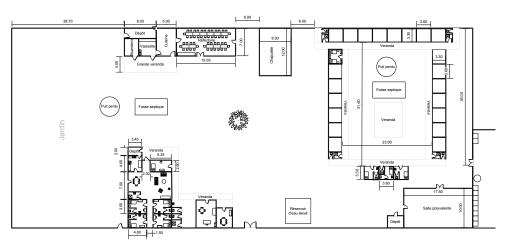

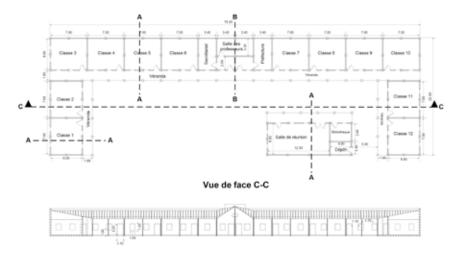
A) Detail of layout of the new school and orphanage constructions

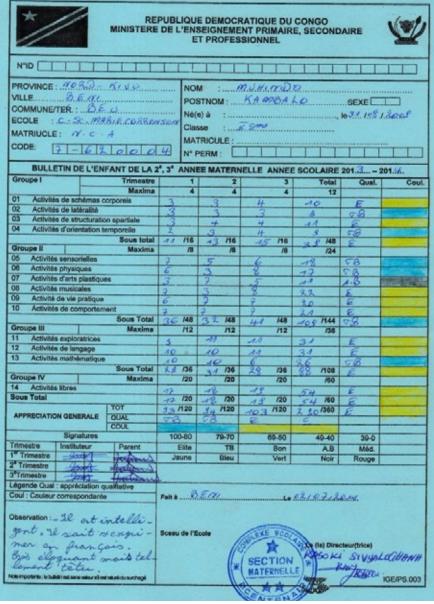
